A.1 Transforming Aging Through the Power of Reading

Susan Ostrowski, Co-Founder, Reading2Connect – Niantic, CT

Reading is a joy the vast majority of older adults can experience—even those living with cognitive impairment. In this session we'll discuss how aging affects the reading process, while also debunking rigid beliefs about who is capable of reading independently. Attendees will practice creating high-quality, age/dementia-friendly reading material as a way to build bridges of expression and understanding. Learn how to reduce isolation, boredom, and over-dependency by fostering personal fulfillment and growth through reading.

A.2 Foundations of Supervision: An Effective, Experience-Based Curriculum for New Supervisors

Foundations of Supervision was developed by HR leaders in the Kendal system and utilizes a multi-media approach to train front-line supervisors with little formal training or experience. A.4 Quality of Life at a CCRC: A Case Study of Community Members' Perspectives

A small group of residents of Wake Robin, a Continuing Care Retirement Community (CCRC) in Shelburne, VT, sought the help of University of Vermont researchers to document what makes their community special. Together they undertook a qualitative case study that explored the culture and practices that have enabled Wake Robin to create and sustain a high quality of life and a strong sense of community and belonging—a context where residents realize their potential for continuing growth throughout their later years. Learn how Wake Robin staff and residents plan to use the data to explore challenges of competing needs and priorities while still honoring their positive community culture.
